Green products can be made from natural ingredients or recycled content materials. Products that do not contain toxic chemicals or generate a toxic waste product during manufacturing are green too.

Green products may not be the cheapest items, but you are lessen your impact on the earth. Buying a green product means less overall cost to the earth, which starts with obtaining a natural resource to manufacturing, packaging and transporting the product to the store. Make the choice to be trendy and environmentally friendly.

Green Product Rules

Being green does rule. Ok. No matter where people go, there are rules to follow. Becoming more green means attempting to follow at least some of the rules.

- Practice ways to reduce trash and if you generate trash, then reuse it.
- Take care of what you own now, so maintain and repair them.
- Buy durable or built to last products.
- Buy products made from recycled content to promote recycling and useless virgin natural resources.
- Buy products made from natural or nontoxic materials.
- Buy local to support your local manufacturers, artists, farmers or businesses.
- It reduces energy consumption required when goods are transported far distances.
- Buy products that do not contain ingredients that harmed animals.
- Buy products that use mininum packaging. Less packaging means less trash being buried
- Buy bottles or containers that can be refilled, reused, or recycled.
- Buy energy efficient products, so go solar or look for the "Energy Star

CLOTHING ADVICE

Something Old

What went out of style when your parents were younger eventually is back in style. Of course, classic clothes are never out of style like comfortable worn blue jeans.

- Shop Vintage. Vintage clothing that was sewed well can last long after todayís cheaper, less durable clothing falls apart. Trendy vintage stores may be pricey, but it is worth it.
- If you are really into the hunt, then shop at resale shops and donation centers to find a unique style.
- Comfortable clothing can come from the hand-me-downs or trading clothing with friends. Mix and match to make your own style.
- Contribute to the cause by trading, donating or selling your unwanted clothes. If nothing else, then begging and borrowing from family and friends will allow you to expand your wardrobe without wrecking your wallet.

Something New

Buying new can be necessary. Look for clothing made out of natural fibers such as wool, silk, linen, hemp or organic cotton. Natural fibers can be found in shirts to swim wear to shoes. Natural fibers are created from renewable resources such as sheep's wool and cotton plants instead of polyester or rayon. Synthetic fibers are made from petroleum, a nonrenewable resource. Natural fibers have simple and cost effective washing instructions. They can be washed in cold water and hung to dry, which saves the cost of heating the water, running the machine and dry cleaning.

- Avoid the tags that read dry clean only.

 Many toxic chemicals are used to dry clean clothes.
- Ramatex, Earth Ragz and Eco yarn are clothes made from 100% post consumer recycled fibers where the cotton scraps are sorted and used again. Ecospun is a combination of half recycled cotton scraps and half recycled plastic soda pop bottles. It is just as soft as other cotton shirts, but more water resistant. Recycled plastic bottles may be found in some fleece like the line produced by Patagonia.
- Do not forget to arm yourself with your own shopping bag. Make sure you reuse or recycle the packing materials, especially the cardboard boxes from online shopping.

Clothing Resources

Let your fingers do the walking in the local and regional yellow pages under resale and vintage shops. Locate stores that sell clothing lines made from natural or recycled content fibers. For example, Lion and Blue in Lakewood sells the Earth Ragz line. Green manufactures should have websites to either sell their products online or list where their products are sold locally.

SCHOOL SUPPLIES

When preparing for the back-to-school season, invest in better quality supplies that will last more than one year. A life time warranty or free repair guarantee from companies like Jansport will keep that backpack looking like new.

Start off the school year with recycled content products such as 100% recycled paper products (computer, art and notebook paper, folders, journals, address books and index cards). The best percentage of post-

consumer is 100%, which means all the paper came from people that recycled it. It saves the trees and forests.

- Use 100% recycled paper or any post-consumer recycled content.
- Find tree free pencils.
- Write on clipboards and draw straight lines with rulers from recycling plastic or rubber.
- Use less toxic products too.
- Use paper clips instead of adhesives.
- Write with soy based inks on chlorine-free paper.
- Use vinyl free items.
- Look for solar powered calculators or other electrical gadgets. If solar is not an option, then consider using an electronic with rechargeable batteries.
- If the homework paper did not make it on the refrigerator or the keep sake box, then recycle it.
- Use refilled toner cartridges for printers.
- Make sure to send back the empties to be refilled and reused. In some cases, groups can earn cash by recycling printer cartridges.




FOOD SHOPPING
